

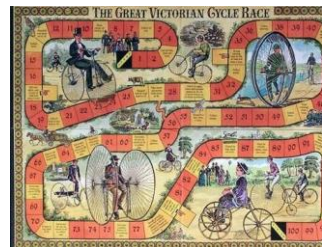
THE VICTORIANS

English/History

- Research Victorian handwriting. Can you write like a Victorian?
- Write a newspaper article announcing Queen Victoria's coronation.
- If you were Queen Victoria, what laws would you have made and why?
- Write an acrostic poem for Victorians.
- Make and write a postcard sent from London in Victorian times.
- Find out some foods the Victorians liked to eat and use these to design a menu for a Victorian café.
- Write a diary entry from a child who lives in the poorhouse. Talk about your day, what kind of things you do, and how you feel.
- What can you find out about the Victorians? Create a fact file.

Science

- Research famous Victorian inventions. Choose one and create a poster advertising its use.
- Create a list of items which we use now, which were also used in the Victorian era.



Maths

- Research Kings and Queens of the past. Create a bar chart to compare the length of Queen Victoria's reign with reign of other Kings and Queens.
- Measure out ingredients to make a Victoria sponge.
- Compare coins from the Victorian era with coins from today. Are there any differences/similarities?



Geography

- Draw or trace a world map. Mark the countries which were part of the British Empire.
