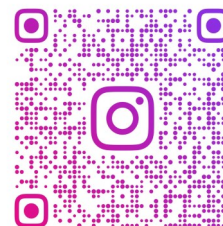

Last week, during the BIG Breakfast, we had a visit from our Educational Psychologist, Jamie Allen. He sent a report for the event as he was so overwhelmed by our School community, and we thought it was important to share it with you all.

"I attended the Big Breakfast in an attempt to be better seen by the community and learn about the values and ethos at St Anne Line school. It was an absolute joy and honour to be part of such a wonderful occasion.

It was clear that staff had worked very hard to ensure it ran as smoothly as possible, and it is clearly valued by staff, parents, and children. The fact that so many parents and children were willing to wait in a line for a breakfast (however good, says a lot about the community aspect that this event creates, it is more than just breakfast, it is an opportunity for children to open up their world to parents, an opportunity to connect with the school and their staff.

I was able to speak to some parents and the key themes that came from these conversations are that the whole family look forward to this event, they enjoy the school opening their arms to them and they feel the sense of community that the school is trying to offer.

I must acknowledge that not every school has this connection, and I must also acknowledge the role that faith must have in supporting this connection. It does go beyond this, and it is down to the hard work of the staff to create the familial feel that I observed today. The sense of connection is incredibly vital in a world that often feels disconnected.

Staff also appreciate the opportunity to meet with parents and feel part of the wider community as their contact with parents can be limited by the nature of their role. It was felt by the staff supporting the event that it was a vital part of the ethos of the school."
